### **MEET THE MAYOR & OTHER OCEAN COUNTY SERVICES**

Come on out for a CV4 TOWN HALL on **WEDNESDAY**, **AUGUST 17th at 10:00AM** to meet **Mayor Robert Hudak** who was elected Mayor of Manchester Township in 2021.

Mayor Hudak's top priorities have been to reduce wasteful government spending, combat overdevelopment in Manchester to preserve our way of life, and to keep Manchester Township as one of the lowest tax rates in Ocean County while enhancing services and promoting business growth.

Mayor Hudak will provide town updates and answer resident questions.

### Also participating in the event are representatives from:

- **Police Department Police Detective** presenting along side Mayor Hudak will speak on senior community safety, how to identify scams, and also to answer questions.
- Ocean County Senior Services to discuss what services they offer to our residents.
- State of New Jersey Department of Human Services—Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired (CBVI) to present Independent Living Skills Services designed to help people with age-related failing vision manage daily living skills around the home. Joining this team will be an Eye Health Nurse to help residents identify and organize their medications.

There will be presentations, health screenings, individual tables for private conversations, take-home materials, Q&A sessions, and lots more.

### HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT CHARGING AN ELECTRIC CAR AT VILLAGE FOUR

Manchester Township's Electrical Inspector gave us the low-down on what's needed to install a charging station at your unit here in our village.

FIRST, a CV4 Modification Form is required by the office. Electric Permits will not be issued without village approval.

An Electric Permit IS REQUIRED because the wiring is not typical and the existing outlet requires rewiring to the electric panel to meet the necessary power draw.

A Licensed Electrician IS required ONLY if the unit is in a multi-unit building and not a stand-alone. For example – One side of an Oxford wants to install an outlet to charge an electric car, this DOES require a licensed contractor because of the panel box in the opposite unit. Those in single family homes are allowed to do the wiring themselves but, they must still apply for an electrical permit and receive approval from Manchester Township.



Trustees have added an additional rule for our units that only cars with garages are permitted to install the outlet for obvious reasons. Units with no garage would mean having the outlet attached to the unit's outside wall or on a pole which then would require the power cord to run across grass or sidewalks to go between the car and building. To best control this potential safety hazard, only units with garages will be allowed to install an electric car charging outlet/station.

### THE HIGH COST OF RECKLESSNESS

CV4 assigns four men every Monday and Thursday for garbage pickup. It's an important function keeping our community clean. Our maintenance crews are outdoors in beastly hot, freezing cold and everything in between weather, plus high pollen days, which as I'm sure you are all aware, makes you feel miserable. Most of us would call it an unpleasant task at best; more than that, trash collection is hazardous. In fact, solid waste haulers rank third on the list of the riskiest jobs in the United States, according to a study by the Florida Center for Solid and Hazardous Waste Management, Miami, and the University of Miami.

Garbage collectors are often hit by neglectful drivers who drive around garbage trucks without looking. On that note, the CV4 maintenance staff recently brought it to the Board's attention that beyond the difficulty of the work itself, they must watch out for drivers who are not looking out for them.

You may recall July's newsletter article "Give Us a Brake," reminding motorists to respect our garbage collection men and tree trimmers. We hear that some drivers continue with reckless, discourteous habits, causing several near misses. If a worker motions a speeding driver to slow down, he sometimes receives back dismissive waves or obscene gestures.

The same happens when our branch trimming vehicle parks for a job. Too often drivers speed by, pass too close, or even drive up on common area grass.

Faced with such recklessness and a wanton disregard for our staff, your Trustee Board has approved the purchase of stop arms for each of the two garbage trucks at the cost of \$985.60 (\$492.80 each) to shield your trash collectors. Additionally, to discourage "brush backs" of tree trimmers, we approved detour sandwich board signs for \$1660.40. With tax/shipping added in, the total cost for the stop arms and detour sandwich boards was \$3.058.15.

This unbudgeted expense should not have been necessary. Since the men who carry off our garbage confronted the Board with their fears of serious injury or death, we could not ignore the matter and do nothing. Reaching out to Manchester Township's Police proved futile. First, since ours are private roads, police will not enter a private community for routine township traffic enforcement. Second, does anyone really want them hanging around, as though we can't govern ourselves with common sense and self-control? Third, if we cry to them that our residents are out of control behind the wheel, what does that say about our mental/moral state? Our self-control, our "Senior Citizen" dignity?

So, we went ahead and bought the safety equipment with the hopes that these deterrents will work in protecting our staff and making our roads safer for all. Remember, our employees are working hard to keep your Village, our Village clean. What would you do if your negligence caused an injury or death to someone or yourself? A little consideration goes a long way.

### GOOD STUFF TO KNOW

- MOD Form Update—effective immediately each Modification Form must attach the contractor's current NJ license and insurance certificate. These will no longer be kept on file as it has become too labor intensive to chase the contractors down who do not keep their information current with the office. As a reminder, certificate holders CAN do the work on their own; however, regardless of who does the work, any permits Manchester Township requires (electric, plumbing, etc.) must still be obtained from the Manchester Building Department. Please contact Manchester Township if in doubt of the permit requirements.
- Word at the pump is that with the updated 15% Ethanol in most fuel mixes, drivers should be using a <u>gas additive</u> to keep the engines running at peak performance because not all engines are rated for anything over 10%. Check with your mechanic!
- <u>Stout Bus</u> began assessing a 6% fuel surcharge effective July 1st. After discussing our true bus service needs on Tuesday evenings with Jerry we decided to drop the BINGO bus which has significantly reduced to one or two people each week. The board negotiated the reduced service to cover the new charges which has allowed us to remain within our annual bus budget while not making a drastic change to the overall village bus service.

### Kirms Photography

I've not run this article in quite some time, so this month we'll have a refresher course. Did you ever wonder what is going on inside your camera, or cell phone, when you take a picture? Many things are going on simultaneously, but here's the quick version.

When you push the shutter button halfway (camera) or touch the screen (cell phone) the focusing system is activated and the camera/phone locks on the subject. The metering system measures the amount of light and determines the correct exposure.

When you push the shutter the rest of the way, (camera) or tap the screen (cell phone) the aperture (similar to the iris in your eye) opens to the correct size, and the sensor chip (digital "film") is charged and the shutter opens to allow the light to hit the sensor. In cameras without a shutter and cell phones, the sensor is charged for the correct amount of time for a proper exposure.

When the correct amount of light has hit the sensor the shutter closes. The camera processes the image and stores it to the digital media.

### DON'T LET SOME SAP GET THE BEST OF YOU



Living in the Pine Barrens comes with unique challenges, one being pine tree sap which is essential to carrying nutrients throughout the tree. Excessive sap may often cause broken branches in a storm and is usually not a cause for concern. This does not mean the tree is dead or dying. Affected branches can be pruned to lessen the dripping sap, if caught early.



Oil based products such as household cooking oils, baby oil, or a product called GooGone (small bottles are available at Dollar Tree) easily removed sap from cars and most surfaces. Nail polish remover also removes sap but be careful to NOT use nail polish remover on your car as it will also remove the paint!

TIPS like this can help us to better get along with nature here in this beautiful area of NJ.
