Bookkeeper's Corner - By Tom Falkowski

Wow!! It sure has been a hot Summer thus far! I hope everyone is staying cool and enjoying whatever free time you may have these days...

I want to give some clarification regarding New Jersey property tax refund/credit programs. The Homestead Benefit and Senior Freeze (Property Tax Reimbursement) programs are separate programs, and separate applications must be filed every year for each program. The PTR forms are due this year by October 31, 2022. The filing deadline for the latest Homestead Benefit Application - Tax Year 2018 - was November 30, 2021.

Qualifications for the Homestead Rebate are:

You were a New Jersey resident; and You owned and occupied a home in New Jersey that was your principal residence on October 1, 2018*; and Property taxes for 2018 were paid on that home; and You met the 2018 income requirements:

\$150,000 or less for homeowners age 65 or over or blind or disabled; or

\$75,000 or less for homeowners under age 65 and not blind or disabled.

Qualifications for the Property Tax Reimbursement:

You (or your spouse/civil union partner) were:

65 or older on December 31, 2020; or actually receiving federal Social Security disability benefit payments (not benefit payments received on behalf of someone else) on or before December 31, 2020.

You lived in New Jersey continuously since December 31, 2010, or earlier, as either a homeowner or a renter.

Homeowners. You owned and lived in your home since December 31, 2017, or earlier (and you still owned and lived in that home on December 31, 2021). The 2020 property taxes due on your home must have been paid by June 1, 2021, and the 2021 property taxes must be paid by June 1, 2022.

Income Limit

Your total annual income (combined if you were married or in a civil union and lived in the same home) was:

2020 - \$92,969 or less; and

2021 - \$94,178 or less

You are not eligible for a reimbursement on a vacation home or second home or property that you rent to someone else.

I hope this was helpful! Enjoy the rest of your Summer!

GO AHEAD, HAVE ANOTHER DRINK

No, I don't encourage alcoholism, which is a real problem, even here in the Villages. I intend in this piece to raise consciousness regarding an aspect of nutrition often lost amid the maze of proteins, carbs, fats, vitamins, minerals, other supplements.

Dehydration: a four-syllable word meaning your body lacks enough water to function properly. This happens most typically during summer weather, but also occurs year-round. Winter air can be very dry, and not a time of year when we feel like having cold drinks. Every time you use more fluid than you take in, you're technically dehydrated.

How would your body recognize dehydration? You may feel tired or have a headache. Pay attention to how often you urinate and especially to color. Your output should appear light yellow or almost clear and have substantial volume. If output is low and of a dark hue, such as amber, you are likely dehydrated. [All quality multivitamins and especially B complex pills contain pigments which do temporarily make urine bright yellow for two or three hours]. Dehydration also commonly causes dry skin and constipation. It can even predispose you to bloods clots, especially on a long airplane flight.

Older adults are more likely than younger people to become dehydrated. We seniors do not recognize thirst the same as we did when we were younger. You should NEVER, EVER wait until you feel very thirsty to drink water. Make a point to sip water periodically throughout the day, regardless of how you feel. If you hate the taste of city water, try bottled water, flavored water drinks, club soda, seltzer. Fruits, soups, popsicles, decaf beverages [especially hot decaf coffee and tea during cold weather] are other ways to take in more liquid.

Dehydration can lead to urinary tract infections, heat stroke, heart problems, and kidney complications. Speak with your doctor about hydration, how much liquid you should imbibe daily. Dialysis patients and those with heart failure must exercise caution not to take in too much liquid and experience fluid overload. CONTACT YOUR DOCTOR BEFORE ANY CHANGE IN NORMAL ROUTINE. For those in otherwise decent health, good hydration will surely help improve your total health over time. And that's something we can All drink to!

A Few Quick Tips:

- 1. Carry a reusable water bottle with you and keep it filled with fresh liquid.
- 2. Make consuming water a habit by drinking at certain times each day.
- 3. Toss in slices of fresh lemon, lime, apple, cucumber, berries. [I add a spoonful of frozen blueberries or a fresh peach slice to a glass of plain seltzer very refreshing].
