#### **Bookkeeper's Corner**

Well, I am back as the weather sure has gotten chilly! I hope everyone is doing well and had a wonderful Thanksgiving!

First off, I would like to address the new NJ ANCHOR program. ANCHOR is separate from the Senior Freeze state program. This program replaces New Jersey's Homestead Rebate as the state's primary program for property tax relief, but the application process will be quite similar. They expect about 2 million residents — including, for the first time, some renters — will qualify for relief through the ANCHOR program.

You may have already received a mailing from NJ with instructions on how to file. The deadline to file has been extended to January 31, 2023. If you file on time and qualify, you should receive your benefit sometime late Spring of 2023. The payment will be paid in the form of a direct deposit or check, not as credits to property tax bills. You can visit the ANCHOR website at: <a href="https://nj.gov/treasury/taxation/anchor/index.shtml">https://nj.gov/treasury/taxation/anchor/index.shtml</a> for additional information.

#### ANCHOR eligibility is as follows:

Homeowners with income of \$150,000 or less will receive \$1,500.

Homeowners with income of more than \$150,000 and up to \$250,000 will receive \$1,000.

Renters with income of \$150,000 or less will receive \$450.

There is no age limit.

As we near the conclusion of 2022, we all will be prepping for 2023. With that in mind, also in this newsletter is a list of the new monthly carrying charges for each model unit for 2023. For those not aware yet, the Board did an excellent job of actually lowering the charges each month for every unit. If only all other costs of living would follow suit.

So, also with the new year, you should be receiving your new payment coupons for 2023 reflecting these new rates. These should go out in the mail the beginning or middle of December. Please be patient as the process of printing and mailing can be quite time consuming, as you can imagine, with 1,190 units at CV4. Thankfully we have tremendous volunteers that aid in completing this substantial task.

#### **FALL GUTTER CLEANING UPDATE**



To fill the gap of the two maintenance staff we're currently down the board has decided to outsource our fall gutter cleaning project this year.

Outsourcing will allow us to keep the reduced staff working on other important village maintenance in addition to the many work orders that continue to come in on a daily basis. Garbage collection pulls 4 people off other tasks two days each week making it tough for them to also clean out all the gutters in our large village in a timely manner.

We're making sure this project won't get pushed into the Winter months when there's a good possibility water may freeze and roofs will become too slippery for our guys to safely manage the project, or cause bigger repairs in the Spring.

The Board ran the numbers and when comparing the cost of outsourcing against the salary surpluses for the two unfilled maintenance positions, we're still ending 2022 with an additional \$55K in the maintenance salary budget while getting the gutters done more efficiently this year due to the lack of staff.

Please be patient as we wait for the pine trees to shed more needles so we can do the best job possible.

A VERY BIG HOLIDAY THANK YOU to everyone who has dropped off holiday goodies to the office to thank the staff & maintenance crew for their hard work. A new resident recently brought a complete pasta lunch for everyone that didn't last long, as you can imagine.

The cards, notes, and emails that come into the office are becoming more frequent and the hand-written notes of appreciation make us all smile knowing their hard work is being recognized by our residents.
