Boy is it cold BUT Spring is almost here, Tuesday, March 19 JUST 47 days away!!! At least as of Feb 1st!!!

January left us with quite a bit of snow. This last weather event left a weird depth pattern. Freak wind gusts caused random drifting, such that depth measurements varied widely. Our "official" clubhouse total was too conflicting to make the call for Village removal, but many residents experienced higher totals, depending on which area of our seven linear miles of streets coincides with their specific address. The Board and I acknowledge the ensuing frustration and we sincerely apologize to our residents for the measuring discrepancy. There is no way for us to know when any street or driveway will be cleared, so please be patient and know everyone is doing the best they can. Remember, only 47 more days until Spring!!

On another note, we are working on getting the 2023 books closed, and already have a meeting with the Auditor Anthony, and with Cheryl from 'CFO your way'. We are busy working on the books now, so we are on schedule for our Audit meeting in April.

Please know we are working diligently to get all the payables and receivables for 2024 into the accounting system so we can begin providing you the monthly income and expense reports again. The temporary bookkeeper we had was writing checks to keeps us current with all vendors, however, this information was not being entered in the accounting system. We are working hard to have this information entered correctly and expeditiously so as to have the financials in the newsletter as quickly as possible which will also allow us to move forward with regular financials in the monthly newsletters.

Additionally, we are finalizing details with a company who we will be working with us to out-source our bookkeeping. We will provide more information with you as we progress with this undertaking.

#### **AN EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS FROM OCEAN COUNTY:**

In Ocean County we know from experience how important it is for all of us to prepare for a weather emergency. Preparations include creating or updating a disaster supply kit and a battery powered radio for example. In the event of a hurricane, the National Weather Service can usually provide up to five days of advanced warning, however, being prepared in advance, whether for a hurricane, Nor'easter, blizzard or any inclement weather, could save a life. It is recommended that essential items be brought along, including but not limited to prescription drugs, oxygen, bottled water, and any special dietary foods. The Ocean County Health Department in cooperation with the Ocean County Office of Emergency Management has provided an excellent guide called "Emergency Preparedness Disaster Tips" that includes special considerations for seniors, those who have pets and caregivers of older adults or children. If you would like a copy, call their office at 732-929-2091 or 1-800-668-4899. You can never be too prepared in case of an emergency.

#### MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP LOCK BOX PROGRAM

Manchester Senior Services will be providing combination-key lock boxes to Manchester Residents 60 years of age and older, FREE of charge.

This program is intended to provide <u>vulnerable seniors</u> with a way of letting emergency responders enter their home in an emergency, without causing damage to their doors or windows.

We <u>strongly encourage</u> that once a combination is set and a key has been placed inside, it be shared with the Manchester Township Police Department by calling **732-657-6111**\*

\*Residents are responsible for setting up their own combination codes and maintaining the lock box.\*

#### **2024 Vendor Contracts**

Our 2024 Roofing Project contract has been awarded to Stanley Contracting once again. The Board has requested proposals from painting and gutter contractors. The list of units to be painted in 2024 will be posted in the March newsletter. As in the past, our maintenance staff will again be walking through the Village in late February - early March to assess each individual unit for priority repairs. They will note the condition of driveways, gutters, roofs, garbage cans, tree removals and crawlspace covers by using a 1-4 priority system, 1 being a priority and 4 not being a priority. Any repairs identified as 1 and 2 priorities in 2023 that were not repaired in 2023 will be moved onto the new list first.

As these lists are constantly being updated as priorities arise, for example, someone on the priority list in 2023 for a roof repair, but the roof was not leaking, instead in poor condition, would move down the list if a wind storm occurs blowing shingles off other roofs causing leaks and critical damage inside the unit. Those roofs would then jump to a priority 1, and the roof not leaking, but in poor condition, would move down the list.

**BE ON THE LOOKOUT**...OZANE, our termite company will begin their annual inspections between Wednesday, January 31st and Thursday, February 1st. The inspections will take approximately 2-3 weeks. They begin with Adams Court and go alphabetically. If they cannot gain access to your garage because you are either not home or unavailable, they will leave a door tag for you to contact them to schedule an inspection. **IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO CONTACT THEM if you receive a door tag**. Any termite damage that results from the resident not contacting Ozane, becomes the resident's responsibility. If you have any questions, please contact the office.

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\*Payoff verification may delay the process. In the event of a payoff, additional paperwork may be required. Vehicle title must be on hand or able to be secured from the lending bank if a loan is in place. Purchases over \$20,000 and/or out of state titles may take longer than 20 minutes. A MESSAGE FROM THE MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP OFFICE OF THE TAX ASSESSOR DATED JANUARY 2, 2024:

Dear Property Owner:

The Township of Manchester will be conducting a complete reassessment of all properties in the Township for the year 2025. This process will begin within the next few weeks. The purpose of the reassessment is to determine the "fair market value" as of October 1, 2024 of each property. This will ensure a fair and equitable distribution of the tax burden among all property owners.

To properly assess your property, a complete inspection of the interior and exterior of each building is necessary. Exterior photographs of every structure in the Township will also be taken. In certain instances where an income-producing property is involved, other pertinent information may be required.

For your protection, each representative of the Township will be provided with a letter of identification as well as photographic identification. Please be sure to ask for the letter and the photo ID and <u>DO NOT</u> permit anyone who is unable to properly identify themselves to enter your property.

Prior to results of the reassessment being completed, each and every property owner will receive a notice of the value to be placed on their property. Upon request, the Tax Assessor's office will then conduct a complete and informal review of the value with any taxpayer. Each notice will set forth the procedure to be followed in requesting a hearing.

Additional information concerning the Reassessment process is available on the Township website at <a href="https://www.manchestertwp.com">www.manchestertwp.com</a>. Informational meetings will be held at the Municipal Building, Whiting Firehouse and within each adult community to further explain the process and to answer questions with regard to the Reassessment. The results who live in an adult community will be notified by their association concerning the meeting date. The dates of the meetings at the Municipal Building and Whiting Firehouse will be announced in local newspapers and on the township website.

At anytime during the reassessment, please feel free to contact my office with any questions or concerns you may have. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

#### **ADVISORY BOARD**

Our Advisory Board (formerly District Representatives) is made up of volunteers from our Community. There are 1190 homes, divided up into 22 districts, which currently have only 6 volunteers. The Advisory Board is always available to assist our residents by helping them solve problems, review the Rules and Regulations, and to share Village news. The Board meets the 2nd Thursday of every month (excluding July and August) at 1pm, and residents are always invited to join us 1 hour before our meeting (at Noon) to discuss any concerns they may have, or to just go over the Rules and Regulations and/or By-Laws. One of the most common complaints we have are about pet owner's responsibilities, regarding barking, defecating on lawns, etc. Many of our residents take pride in the upkeep of their lawns so you can see where that could be a problem.

A few things to remember: on windy days, be mindful of the recycling items that may blow all over your area or your neighbor's. Regarding parking, if you expect to have overnight guests that will need parking, make sure you check in with the office in the event they require a temporary parking permit. And speaking of parking, if you park on the street during the day, please make sure you do not park too close to stop signs of your neighbor's driveway, making it difficult for them to get in and out.
