A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT... In celebrating our 50th anniversary, I would be remiss to talk about the parking issues throughout our community. It's safe to say that 50 years ago, there were not half as many cars on the road as there are today, which carries over to the limitations on parking in our community and many of the 55+ communities as old as ours (and older). They simply were not built with the thought in mind that people would own 2, 3 and even 4 cars, not to mention boats, campers and RVs. That being said, every member of the Crestwood Village Co-Op Four community must follow the rules, or chaos ensues, which is why the Board must enforce the Rules & Regulations currently in place.

Parking violations are one of the most common violations the office receives, which is why we feel we must outline the parking rules yet again. This time; however, **beginning June 1st**, anyone in violation of the parking rules will first receive a violation tag, and *if* the violation is recurring, your vehicle(s) will be towed at your own expense via TNT Recovery. If the violations continue, in addition to being towed, you will receive fines, charged to your maintenance account, which if unpaid, will ultimately be turned over to our attorneys. Below, are the Rules that are most frequently violated:

Rule 1.3: At no time is "overnight" street parking permitted. Vehicles remaining on the street between 12:00am and 6:00am are considered to have been parked "overnight".

Rule 1.4: NO parking is permitted on the grass. Parking that blocks access to parking areas (and this includes any delivery drivers, contractor vehicles, etc.), parking within ten (10) feet of fire hydrants, parking in turnarounds or blocking driveways is prohibited... All buildings MUST be kept accessible to police, fire, ambulance and all other emergency vehicles.

Rule 1.4(a): No vehicle at any time is to be parked in a driveway with any portion of it extending into the street.

Rule 1.5: No campers, motor homes, boats or trailers are to be parked overnight in a resident's driveway, at the Clubhouse parking lot or anywhere in Crestwood Village 4. You may bring it to your home for cleaning, loading or light repairs. You may have visitors come to your unit with a motor home and park in the street. They cannot park overnight or use it as living quarters anywhere on Crestwood Village 4 property.

Rule 1.7: Each Certificate Owner in a multi-unit building with no garage (Madison, Essex & Windsor), is entitled to one (1) designated parking space. Each of those parking areas is equipped with two (2) guest spots. Certificate Holders with more than one vehicle may apply for permission to park in the clubhouse parking lot. Guests, if no guest spot is available, may park their vehicle(s) overnight at the clubhouse. A visible note should be left in the windshield of the vehicle listing the owner's name, address where staying and phone number. Certificate Holders may NOT use the guest spaces for their second vehicles.

Rule 1.7(a): Guest Parking Spaces are to be used for Guests of that building only. If you have someone visiting they can use it for one night. If they will be here any longer than one night have them park in the Clubhouse parking lot with the unit address and a contact phone number conspicuously on the dashboard of the vehicle.

Rule 1.8: ... Your driveway is to be used for YOUR vehicle only. NO resident is allowed to use the parking area of another unit without written permission of the unit owner whether the unit is vacant or occupied. Alternate parking forms are available at the front office. No vehicles are to be parked parallel to the street or perpendicular to other vehicles. The only exception is if you have 2 compact cars that can fit in the driveway, one behind the other, without any portion of the vehicle sticking into the street. AT NO TIME ARE 3 VEHICLES ALLOWED TO BE SQUEEZED TOGETHER SIDE BY SIDE TO FIT INTO A DOUBLE DRIVEWAY. ONLY 1 VEHICLE PER SIDE IS ALLOWED UNLESS YOU WERE PERMITTED TO INSTALL ADDITIONAL DRIVEWAY SPACE.

Rule 1.9: Bicycles, tricycles, mopeds and all other motorized transports are considered "vehicles". All Rules & Regulations pertaining to the operation of vehicles shall be observed...

Rule 1.12: Vehicles left in an apparently inoperable condition will be considered abandoned and are not to be used for storage purposes. These vehicles will be subject to towing at the owner's expense.

Rule 1.13: Vehicle owners are expected to promptly correct any vehicle defect or condition (persistent oil leaks, coolant overflows, dragging mufflers, etc.) which may result in a vehicle damaging streets, parking areas or other village property. Failure to do so may result in fines and/or having the vehicle towed. Any damage to the property will be corrected at the Certificate Owner's expense.

*Vehicles in violation of the above rules may be considered "abandoned" after one (1) written warning is left on the windshield of the vehicle. A copy of the warning will be maintained at the clubhouse. Fines of \$50 or more per incident may be assessed for any violation of the above rules after one (1) written warning and the vehicle may be towed at the owner's expense without further notice.

One way to circumvent receiving a parking violation is to clean out your garage if you have one. Garages should be used for purposes intended and not solely for storing goods. Secondly, we do offer paid parking spaces at \$35 per month. While spaces are limited, there currently are some available. Lastly, Rules & Regulations are in place to avoid the chaos you would have without. Show respect to your neighbors and yourself by following the Rules set in place so the community can function smoothly and together.

MANCHESTER TWP TAX ASSESSOR’S OFFICE REASSESSMENT

After several months of preparation, the reassessment of Manchester Township is under way. According to <https://manchestertwp.com/2025-reassessment-information/>, “The Ocean County Board of Taxation approved the Township to conduct a reassessment in November of 2023 to be completed by tax year 2025. The difference between a revaluation and a reassessment is that a reassessment is completed by the municipal Tax Assessor and a revaluation is completed by an outside firm, usually at a much higher cost. Reassessment is the process of appraising all real estate in a municipality according to its full and fair value, to ensure that each property owner pays their fair share of taxes. The process is revenue neutral, meaning the purpose is not to raise property taxes. The purpose is to ensure that the property tax assessments are fair and equitable. The last reassessment in the Township was in 2020. According to New Jersey Division of Taxation records, the average Township property is assessed at only 64.93% of its market value.” The inspection of the Township’s 17,000 homes began in January of 2024, and should be completed by November of 2024. Recent sales of comparable homes are analyzed and used to value all the homes in the Township. The notice of the new assessed values for each property will be mailed in approximately December of 2024. According to the Township’s website, “a reassessment does not necessarily mean an increase in taxes for every homeowner. The tax rate will go down to compensate for the increase in the assessed values. Since not all properties have appreciated in value at the same rate, some tax bills will go up, some will stay the same and others will go down.” Once the Co-Op has more information, we will inform our residents of the effect the reassessment will have on our property taxes. A MESSAGE FROM YOUR NEW CLOSING SUPERVISOR/OFFICE MANAGER

Many of you know me. I first came to CV4 as your Receptionist, worked my way up to Resident Coordinator, and in January, became your new Office Manager and Closing Supervisor, but what you may not know, I also create, write articles for and put together your monthly newsletter. That usually means I'm preoccupied with trying to ensure everyone's articles are submitted, make sense and are added to your newsletter to proofread it so I apologize for any errors. I also want to thank our volunteers who collate and deliver the newsletters, especially Dennis and Arlene Costello. I figured, however, it was time to re-introduce myself, and update you on what's going on in your office, who your office staff members are and what's new with closings. If you attended our Resident's meeting on May 16th, you heard that the Board and I negotiated a cheaper contract for new copiers, and a new, cheaper contract for updated office phones (which should be installed soon). In addition, we are in the process of researching new property management software and a call system to call and/or send texts to residents informing you of emergencies, events, or other important information. This in addition to the usual, Intents to Sell, inspections, working with maintenance on projects like roofing, painting and gutters, and other items that make your Village run. When I first started closings, the biggest complaints from residents, realtors and Board members was the time it would take to schedule a closing and do the actual closing. Typically, from receipt of a contract to the scheduling of a closing, the buyers/sellers would wait, on average, 2-4 months. A typical closing could take anywhere between 2-3 hours...way too long. Upon assuming responsibility, your office staff and I have been working hard streamlining the closing process. With the help of my amazing team, which includes your Office Assistant Kia Figueroa (the smiling face in the front office), and Diane ("Di") Terpstra, our new Resale Coordinator, closings now take about 20-30 minutes, we average about 12 closings per month, and the time between receiving a contract to closing, went from months to 2-3 weeks. I have received many positive remarks from residents and realtors about our new processes, especially how much faster and easier it is now to buy and sell a home in Crestwood Village Four.

We are also looking forward to hiring a new receptionist to assist with modification forms, violation letters and more importantly, you. Your new office staff members and new custodial staff members (John Levendewski and Richie Sohn), will be properly introduced in an upcoming edition of your monthly newsletter.

I look forward to continuing to serve your needs and the needs of your community. In my almost 3 years at CV4, I have met so many friendly and amazing people who I always look forward to seeing and hearing from. 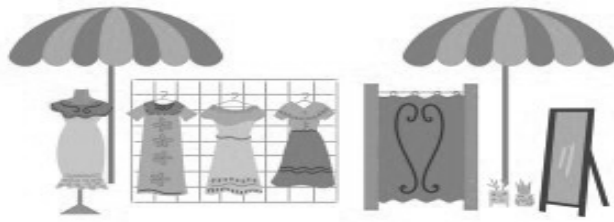
