## A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT.

Please remember that Members are entitled to two free gutter cleanings per year. Any cleanings outside the two free cleanings has a labor charge of \$65.00.

Some things to remember... Our Maintenance Crew will collect small branches and twigs the 1st Wednesday of EVERY month. These items may be placed by the curb the day before collection. Any earlier and it can interfere with mowing. **FENCING CANNOT BE HIGHER THAN 3 FEET AND YOU MUST SUBMIT A MODIFICATION FORM AND GET APPROVAL.** 

Another thing to remember... The front office window closes at 3PM EVERY day to permit our staff, especially the front office staff, Kia and Terri, the time they need to complete tasks. If you need to speak with an office member after 3PM, you may schedule an appointment with them between the hours of 3PM and 4PM. On a FUN note... BOOKKEEPER'S CORNER It's finally June and hopefully we are done with all the rain and we can enjoy the sunny, warm weather! With this in mind, Crestwood Village Four offers Direct Debit payment of your monthly carrying charge at no cost for the service. The process is easy-you can call the office to request a form be mailed or emailed to you or you can pick one up at the clubhouse. Once you have completed all the required information, and attach a VOIDED check, return it to the office and it will take effect the following month! This is a great way to avoid checks being lost, having to write a check every month and coming to the office to drop it off or paying for a stamp-which keeps getting more expensive, and gives you more time to enjoy whatever you love to do! Don't forget, once you sign up for Direct Debit please make sure to inform the office if you close your account due to fraud or any other reason so we can stop the direct debit until we receive a new form with the new banking information. As a reminder, monthly carrying charges are due on the 1st of each month with a grace period until the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. If payment is not received by the 15th, a late charge of \$25.00 is assessed. If you pay by check or Direct Debit and the item is returned by your bank for any reason including Insufficient Funds, Account Closed, or Stop Payment, a \$25.00 charge is assessed. In closing, I would like to remind all residents that unfortunately there are many scams being committed by individuals who try to gain access to personal information such as account numbers, credit card numbers and other personal information. Please remain diligent when answering phone calls soliciting personal information and/or asking to have money sent. Remember the IRS, utility companies and other merchants do not solicit your personal information over the phone or demand immediate payment. If you have an account with someone who calls claiming to work for a company that you have an account with-ask for their name and contact number and tell them you will have to call them back-that usually gets them to hang up! Another big scam is the "family emergency" caller asking for money because they were in an auto accident or they were arrested; again, do not send any money without first verifying that the caller is who they say they are. Make sure you check with other family members first. In closing, I look forward to meeting all the residents in Crestwood Village Four and I am happy to be the new bookkeeper!!

#### DO YOU NOTICE ANY IMPROVEMENT? I SURE DON'T.

At the Manchester Township Board of Education meeting Wednesday night, April 26<sup>th</sup>, the 2023-24 school budget passed, with a 2.58-cent tax increase affected in part by a substantial increase in health care benefits. This \$68,752,776 budget does not cut any positions. For an average Village Four unit, this increase equals about an extra \$36.36 annually, or \$3.12 per month.

While Manchester's overall enrollment has decreased, the district has seen increases in the number of students who need special education services, those who are English language learners, and increases in students who receive free or reduced rate lunches.

The district continues to face bus driver shortages, which means they are contracting out more routes, at a higher cost. To keep drivers the district increased salaries, spending more unbudgeted cash.

The district also has seen an 800% increase in the number of students who are receiving aid in lieu, meaning the district pays money to parents or transport services to bring children to private schools outside the district. This money changes hands when the cost to transport these students exceeds \$1,000; New Jersey pays the district back a portion of the aid-in-lieu costs, but that reimbursement comes in the following year's budget.

Manchester Twp Board of Education rationalizes its increases for various other reasons, but by now, you get the general idea. What are taxpayers getting for this?

An achievement assessment known as the Nation's Report Card shows that New Jersey public school students have significantly lower scores in math and reading for 2022 than they did in 2019 for both. There is no question the COVID-19 pandemic upended learning in New Jersey, but the degree of decreasing test scores in math and reading show just how much. This report, released Wednesday by the National Center for Education Statistics, also revealed a worrisome trend for democracy — slides in U.S. history and civics test scores, according to NCES Commissioner Peggy G. Carr. The report from the NCES, an arm of the Education Department's institute of Education Sciences, looks at the key measurements of math and reading proficiency in 2022 compared with 2019, before the COVID-19 interruptions in learning.

In 2022, scores on the fourth and eighth grade National Assessment of Educational Progress math tests were the lowest since the initial assessments in 1990. Reading scores also declined nationally. The report didn't break out how New Jersey eighth graders performed on U.S. history and civics tests, but the drop in scores nationally is "a national concern," Carr, the NCES commissioner, said in a news release. "Self-government depends on each generation of students leaving school with a complete understanding of the responsibilities and privileges of citizenship," she said. "But far too many students are struggling to understand and explain the importance of civic participation, how American government functions, and the historical significance of events."

Some other findings: U.S. history test scores have dropped since 2018 among all students except among the very top-performing students. In civics, scores declined for lower- and middle-performing students and did not change for higher-performing students. The number of students who performed below the basic level increased in both subjects, and about 4 in 10 eighth graders performed below the basic level in history. Only 13 percent of eighth graders scored at or above the national proficiency level in U.S. history, the lowest proportion to reach that level in any subject on the tests. Only about one-fifth of students were at or above proficiency levels in civics, which is the second-lowest proportion of students reaching that level in any subject. This was the first decline ever recorded by the civics assessment.



**CV** Four Rep Report... Greetings, everyone! Spring has been a bit of a roller coaster, and we're already gliding into summer. Your District Reps wish you a most enjoyable, healthy, and safe season. To that end, and to ensure everyone may fully enjoy their outdoor space, we'd like to offer a few reminders.

As I write this article, our gutters are being cleaned. In fact, by the time you receive this newsletter, they may be completed.

Other cleaning that needs done in CV4, every Spring/Summer, is gardening related. Please make sure your foundation plantings are at least 12 in. away from the unit. The reasons for this are twofold. The most important of which is requested by our Manchester Fire Department to allow for emergency entrance and exit — whether it be because of fire or any other emergency. This is YOUR responsibility. The second is it's mandated by CV4 in order to protect the siding on the outside of your unit to keep it moisture, bug, and dent free. Further, to prevent mold and mildew in your crawlspace, it is resident's responsibility to keep the air vents free of leaves, grass, and tree droppings (like pinecones). I clean mine with my bamboo rake. Takes 3 minutes.

Lastly, but no less important I'm forced to address ANIMALS.

Here's the skinny: We've got rules in place so that everyone can enjoy the great outdoors.

1. Pick up after your pets. For those of you who do not, shame on you! Be advised, this is your only warning. You will be fined. This is CV Four Bylaw, Manchester Township Law, and State of New Jersey Law.

2. Depositing your pet's droppings in another resident's receptacle is against our and Manchester Township's mandates and it's just rude. Your pet's poop is your responsibility and no one else's.

3. <u>All</u> dogs must be leashed. Leashes may not be longer than 6 feet.

4. Pets may NOT be tethered or chained and left outside for any reason or any length of time, no matter how brief.

5. Feeding wild animals (including feral cats) is expressly forbidden. It is dangerous for us and even moreso for them. Please be respectful of nature and don't do it. Thank you. -Carol Marsella-





You can get great shots without going away on a photography vacations. There are many thing to shoot around your home and our state. I enjoy sitting in the back yard, or shooting out a window, to capture some of the wildlife in my yard.

Like any other wildlife photography your two main weapons are patience and knowing your subject. A long lens is also helpful, but not a must.

There's no substitute for patience. Sitting quietly waiting for a good shot is the most important part of shooting animals. A comfortable seat or cushion can make your wait more pleasant. The closer you are to animals the more nervous they get, so you must sit very still. Move very slowly and as little as possible to lessen the chances of scaring your subject.

By knowing your subject's habits you can predict its movements and greatly increase your chance of getting a good shot. Using food to lure your subjects within range is very helpful, especially in backyard shots where the animals are used to seeing people. Playing bird calls on your iPod or stereo will attract birds closer to give you a good shot.
